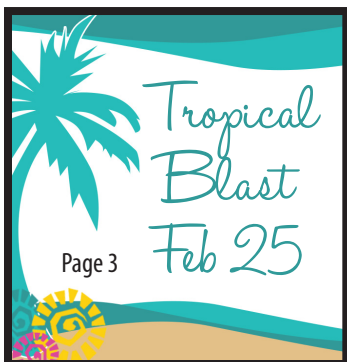
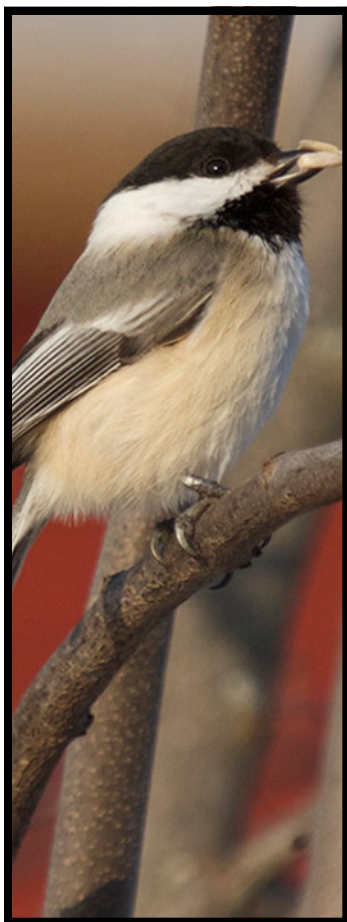

Full Moon Yoga Hike

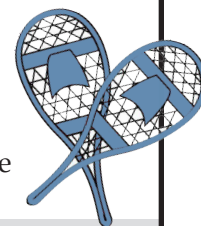
Family Snowshoe Hike

Education & Land Management



The average American child spends 7-10 hours a day looking at a screen and can recognize more than 1,000 corporate logos. They spend far less than 30 minutes a day outdoors and most are unable to recognize 10 native plants in their community. Many children aren't spending enough time outside, yet countless studies have shown that children, especially young children with developing brains, need nature. The benefits of regular time spent in nature are bountiful: better concentration, decreased levels of stress

and depression, a strengthened immune system, better motor control, more creative play, decreased symptoms of ADHD and less bullying (to name a few). Young children who regularly spend time in nature are more likely to grow into adults who care about the environment. Many parents think "regular time" in nature means buying backpacking gear and taking their children on an epic camping trip in a far away place. This isn't the case! In fact, it's best to explore the nature right in your own backyard because you can regularly visit it.

Let us help you connect your young children to nature. This winter, families with pre-school aged children (2-5yrs) are invited to attend the "Raising a Wild Child Preschool Program." This new monthly program will focus on connecting young children (and you!) to nature through exploration, free play and guided activities. Additionally, we will be offering other programs for families with children of all ages. Watch the events calendar on our website and our Facebook page for all the latest.

This fall we completed our third year of Phragmites treatment on the lower East Twin River and lower West Twin River. We are currently finishing up site preparations for frost seeding of approximately 40 acres of pollinator habitat in the preserve. This habitat includes the edge of the preserve along Columbus Street, the two bird parks we have been working on at 12th Street and Columbus Street and on 10th Street, as well as fields at the property near HWY VV. Several partners are involved in this pollinator habitat project including US Fish and Wildlife Service, US Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation Service, and Manitowoc/Sheboygan and SE Chapters of Pheasants Forever.

We also worked with approximately 60 students from Two Rivers High School (TRHS), removing invasive species and planting native trees and shrubs along



Willow Trail. This was part of a multi-faceted educational project funded by the Wisconsin Environmental Education Board (WEEB). Students also participated in an educational activity and took a pre- and post-activity quiz related to everything

they learned. Students from Denmark Community School interviewed the TRHS students and produced a video of the interviews. This program was very successful and the teachers involved expressed interest in repeating it in the future.

We are always in need of volunteers for invasive species work and plan on asking our Barberryans to assist with winter invasive species control. To become
